
COUNTABLE NOUNS

They name anything that we can count.




Here are some countable nouns.


















Countable nouns can be singular or plural.

















When a countable noun is singular, we must use a word like a / an, the, my, one before it.

When a countable noun is plural, we can use it alone.

Use *how many* to ask questions with countable nouns.

How many butterflies can you see? Ten butterflies. A lot.

How many flowers can you see? Not many flowers. Only two.
